You	were	with many friends.
They	were	very happy.

Negative

Subject +	Was / Were + Not (wasn't, weren't) +	Complement
	wasn't	at school yesterday.
You	weren't	with Mom in the afternoon.
He / She	wasn't	in the house.
lt	wasn't	in the tree.
We	weren't	on a bus in the morning.
You	weren't	with many friends.
They	weren't	very happy.
